SPECIAL SERVICES

These services are not included in above figures. Most programs operate at multiple UMMAM sites and counties.

Lifetime Smiles Dental Outreach: 20,222 children in 68 schools/day cares/preschools in 19 counties were screened for visual oral decay. Of these, 6,833 (32%) were referred to a dentist for follow-up. Lifetime Smiles held sealant clinics with children and fluoride clinics were held at schools, health fairs, and UMMAM. Staff did many presentations and distributed over 30,000 toothbrushes, pamphlets, sippy cups, and other oral health items.

Early Detection Works (Breast/Cervical Cancer Program): Covers 31 counties; 676 mammograms; 747 CBEs; 70 abnormal/indeterminate results; 7,473 individual and group contacts for education.

Diabetes Outreach & Education: Covers 8 counties; provided diabetes/nutrition teaching to 143 individuals; screened 412 individuals; conducted 204 presentations.

HIV Outreach/Education: Covers 24 counties; 863 visits; 430 tested; 53 presentations and workshops; 75 special activities.

Farmworker Case Management: Covers 34 counties by assisting migrant and seasonal farmworkers with medical/dental care and treatment plus case management. 2,081 encounters; 1316 case management services, and 472 users.

Prenatal Case Management/Parents As Teachers: 299 women received extra case management, including home/hospital visits and phone call plus prenatal class attendance of 14. PAT had an average caseload of 19 families; held 32 play group sessions with total attendance (duplicated) of 228 parents and children.

Reach Out and Read Early Literacy: Covers four counties. Books distributed in conjunction with well-child medical visits for 6 months – 3 years; books also distributed to older children.
